QUESTION 1:

Santa Monica invested \$8 million of state grant money in a 3-year program that gives homeless individuals who have committed low-level crimes in the city a choice between going to jail or entering a into a "personalized 90-day care coordination plan." Those who successfully complete the program will have their misdemeanor charges dropped. Do you believe this program will reduce or increase crime and disorder in Santa Monica?
